



## Installing RASWin license on a computer manually:

**Prerequisites:** A client to vendor (c2v) file provided by your RASWin dealer.

If RASWin is already installed on the machine you want to install the license you can **can go directly to step 3.**

- 1) Download and Unpack the zip file **RTEVendor.zip**. You can download this file from the following mirror link:

- 2) Run the file **update\_vendor.bat** inside the zip, make sure you deactivate any Antivirus and that you've admin rights, otherwise RTE installation may fail. You'll get a success message:



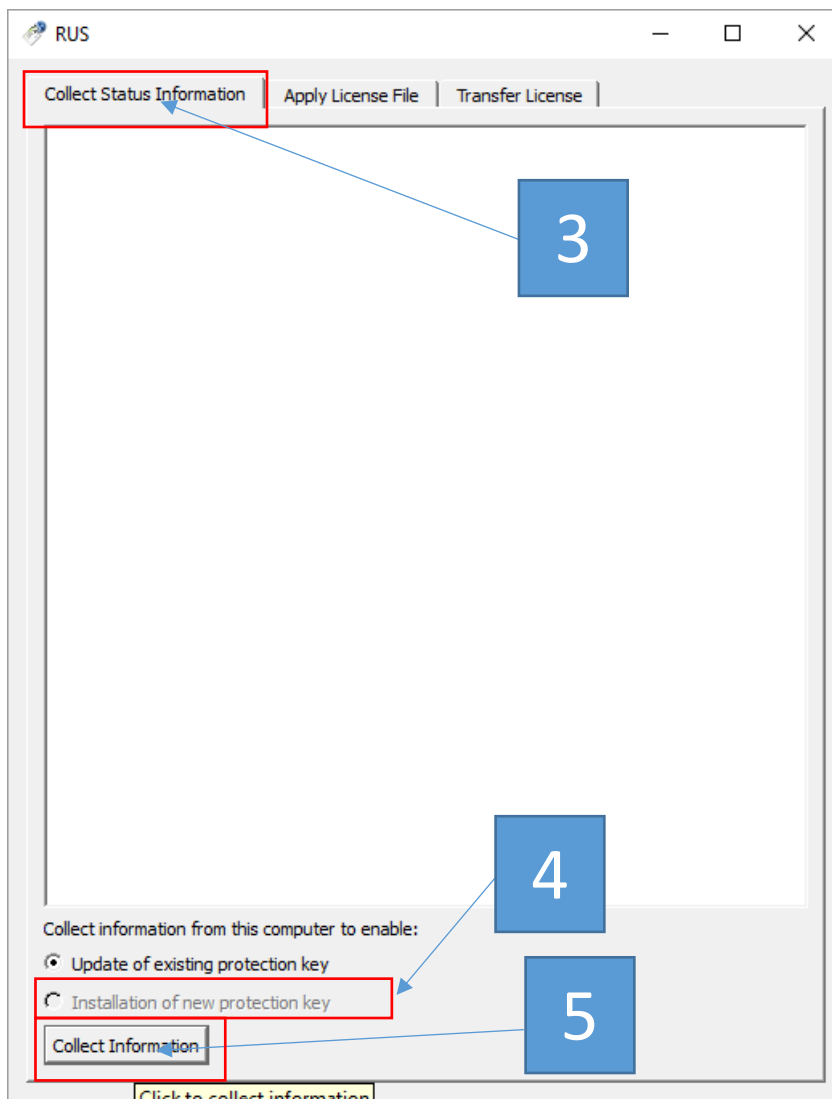
If this step fails and you don't get a success message then you have to manually install the RTE for servers using **Technical Note 0014** before trying to continue.

- 3) Execute tool **RASWinHasp.exe** included on the zip file on step 1. There is a shortcut on the Windows Programs menu too. The file could also be found on the RTE folder where RASWin was installed. And alternative download link to the tool is <http://www.raswin.eu/raswinupdates/RASWinHasp.zip>

In the dialog select tab **Collect Status Information**

On the bottom of the dialog select option **Installation of new protection key.**

Press button **Collect Information.**

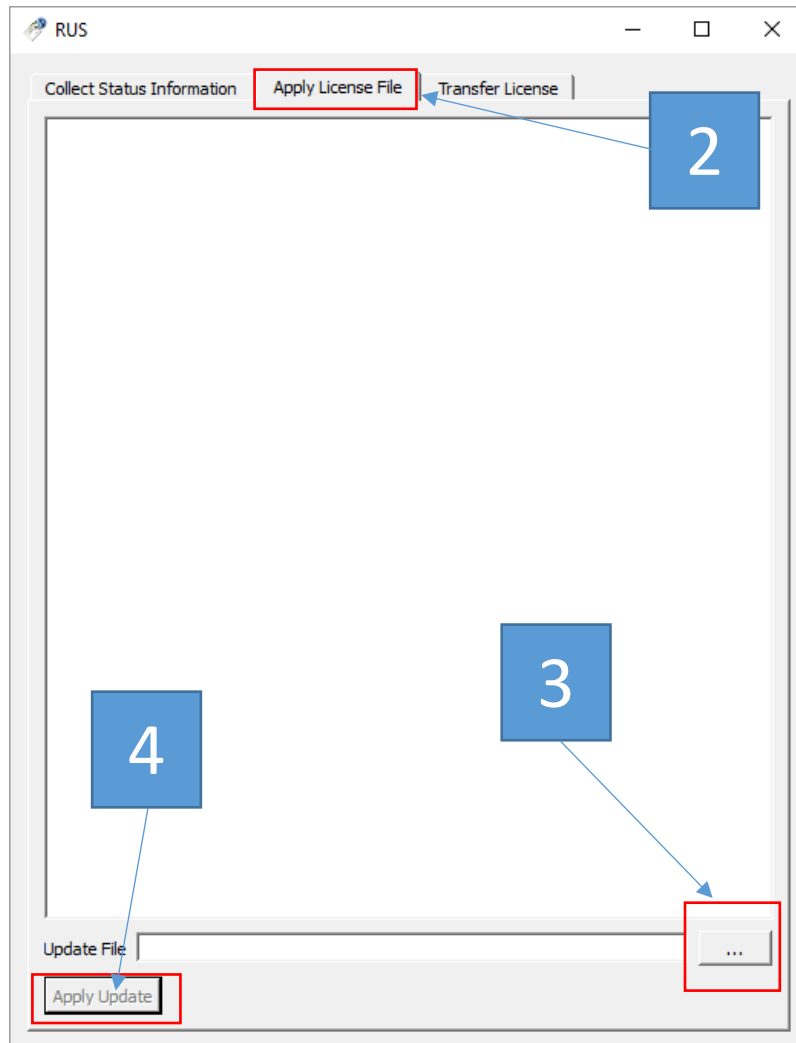


A new C2V file will be generated, give it a meaningful name and sent it to your provider.

After this the provider will send you a new V2C update file. This file should be loaded using the following procedure:



- 1) Execute tool RASWinHasp.exe
- 2) In the dialog select tab **Apply License File**.
- 3) In the bottom of the dialog press the browse file button [...] and locate the V2C file.
- 4) Click **Apply Update**.



After that your license should be update and you can run RASWin normally.
